The transmission pipeline industry in Lancaster County is growing and pre-incident preparedness for potential emergencies is necessary. The Lancaster County Emergency Management Agency (LEMA) and Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) of Lancaster County have developed a unique plan to assist local responders with managing an incident involving Transmission Pipelines.

The self-titled **TR**ansmission **P**ipeline (TRAP) Emergencies Plan provides detailed information on the transmission pipeline infrastructure through Lancaster County including Right-Of-Way (ROW) exposures, Potential Impact Radius' (PIR) and Above Ground Structures (AGS).

LEMA has developed a supporting training program that reviews pipeline hazards, illustrates the transmission ROW's and AGS' in Lancaster County and describes the pre- and post- dispatch operational support the TRAP Plan can provide incident commanders.

The Transmission Pipeline Emergencies program is designed to be delivered locally at your fire station. The class is approximately 1.5 hours in length, ideal for a company level training night, and it is free.
